* * * HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE RE-OPENS * * *

The reorganized Northwest Ohio Preservation Office has re-opened. Reflecting the new thrust of Ohio's Historic Preservation Program, the office has a new title, Regional Coordinating Office, and unified responsibility for both archaeological and architectural-historical resources. A short list of specific assistance activities the coordinating office can provide includes: instruction in completing Ohio Historic Inventory and Ohio Archaeological Inventory forms, assistance in organizing survey and inventory efforts, review and assistance in National Register nominations, advise on the benefits of current tax incentives available for the rehabilitation of some structures, and technical information useful to individual property owners researching and/or restoring historical structures.
