Wen Shu Lee is Professor at San Jose State University. Her recent work focuses on feminism, postcolonialism, and Chinese studies.

"On Inter-Rhetoricity: The Study of Chinese Women's Identities" will examine the naming of Chinese women, the ancient Chinese practice of footbinding, and the formation of marriage resister communities in Taiwan.

Her talk will be followed by a reception sponsored by the Chinese Student and Scholar Association.

Professor Lee has published in such journals as International and Intercultural Communication, the Quarterly Journal of Speech, the Howard Journal of Communication, and the Journal of Applied Communication Research.

In 1995, Lee received the Distinguished Scholarship Award of the International and Intercultural Communication Division of the National Communication Association. She received her Ph.D. in Communication Arts and Sciences from the University of Southern California in 1989.
