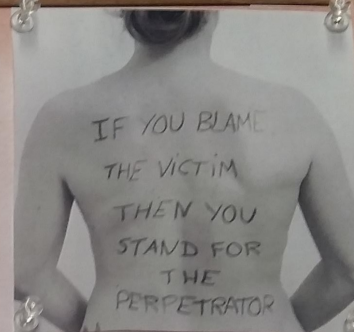

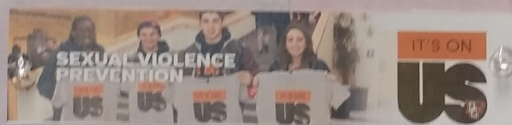

SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION AND RESPONSE

Positive results can be obtained from many different intervention strategies. From a developmental frame of mind it is important to look at how an intervention strategy could be designed to deal with the problem of rape long before it occurs. To do this, one needs to examine where the problem begins. Rape is an act, in almost all cases, where the man is the attacker and the woman is the victim. It was obvious to me that men, i.e., the potential attackers, were not the focus of attention for intervention strategies. One reason may be that institutionally, as well as societally, we tend to blame the rape victims, however subtly. However, more and more decisions handed down by the courts are changing that myth. Rape is a problem, like child abuse, spouse abuse and incest, that will not change overnight. This program is intended to help men become more aware of the problem in order to create an environment more conducive to change.

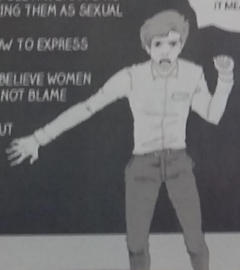


Reality is that most men don't rape, but most men know someone who probably has. Shift away from victim culture. Sometimes people don't know or need to be reminded that it's okay to reach out...

HOW TO NOT RAPE:

1. TEACH YOUNG MEN ABOUT LEGAL CONSENT
2. TEACH YOUNG MEN TO SEE A WOMAN'S HUMANITY INSTEAD OF SEEING THEM AS SEXUAL OBJECTS.
3. TEACH YOUNG MEN HOW TO EXPRESS HEALTHY MASCULINITY.
4. TEACH YOUNG MEN TO BELIEVE WOMEN WHO COME FORWARD AND NOT BLAME THE VICTIM.
5. TEACH YOUNG MEN ABOUT BYSTANDER INTERVENTION.

SAAFE Program
Sexual assault—any type of non-consensual, coerced, or forced sexual conduct or contact is a sexual assault. The SAAFE Program exists to provide options to the victim/ survivor to enable them to make their own choices.

9 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT TITLE IX

1. Title IX is a landmark federal civil right that prohibits sex discrimination in education.
2. Title IX does not apply to female students only.
3. Schools must be proactive in ensuring that your campus is free of sex discrimination.
4. Schools must have an established procedure for handling complaints of sexual discrimination, harassment, or violence.
5. Schools should ensure that a victim doesn't have to share spaces, such as dorms, classes and campus jobs, with his or her assailant.
6. Schools may not retaliate against someone filing a complaint and must keep a complainant-victim safe from other retaliatory harassment or behavior.
7. Schools can issue a no-contact directive under Title IX to prevent the accused student from approaching or interacting with you.
8. In cases of sexual violence, schools are prohibited from encouraging or allowing mediation (rather than a formal hearing) of the complaint.
9. Schools cannot discourage you from continuing your education.
