Michael Staub is Associate Professor of English at Bowling Green State University, and the author of *Voices of Persuasion: Politics of Representation in 1930s America* (Cambridge UP, 1994). His published articles range from the media coverage of the Black Panther Party in the sixties to the racial politics of the Hill-Thomas hearings and Art Spiegelman's *Maus*. He currently is writing a book on the reshaping of American Jewish identities in relation both to memories of the Holocaust and the African-American civil rights struggle.
