Dr. Rosati's lecture will explore the geographic nature of cultural struggle and the spatial relations of media culture in our contemporary moment of ubiquitous electronic media. Rosati elaborates his concept "infrastructures of feeling," to argue that struggles for social justice must simultaneously involve struggles for spatial justice, and that the so-called "right to the city" must also involve a right to the media as well.

Dr. Rosati, Assistant Professor in the Department of Telecommunications, holds a PhD in geography from Syracuse University. His research focuses on media, urban environments, and cultural politics; poverty and urban development; and social movement theory.
