They could say, "Apples will make you super smart you should always eat them!" or "Apples are so yummy you should eat them everyday!"




If an author is trying to give you information, they are trying to help you learn.

Doctors read, bus drivers read, and I know your librarian reads!


And you know what else? All of them read for different reasons!

Wow! Even they are reading! Boy, everyone really does read. Who do you know that likes to read?




Chapter Three: What Do You Like To Read?
